Mayor Jones asked City Clerk/Treasurer Crissa Morris to call the roll in order to determine a quorum. Present for the meeting were City Council members: Lula Jean Burton, Joyce Gregory, Susi Lawson, Bill Leslie, Terry Vanover, and Dwayne Sellers. As there was a quorum present, Mayor Jones called April meeting of the City Council to order. Others in attendance were: Police Chief Whitaker, Fire Chief Martin, and other interested citizens.

Mayor Jones asked for a moment of silence for prayer. Mayor Jones then led all those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

First order of business: Approval of the minutes March 7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> meetings. The motion to approve was made by Lula Jean Burton, seconded by Bill Leslie. Next order of business: Bob Ross from the Lakeview area. Mr. Ross asked Mayor Jones to confirm that he said the City was not intending on annexing the Lakeview area, Mayor Jones confirmed that the City was not intending on annexing that area at this present time.

Mayor Jones read Proclamation 2016-003 declaring April 28<sup>th</sup>, 2016 as Pay It Forward Day.

Next order of business: Placement of a sign on Elm Street stating no right turn. After discussion, it was decided to table this decision until it could be researched further.

Next order of business: 1<sup>st</sup> reading of Ordinance 2016-001. The ordinance was introduced by City Attorney Bruce Orwin. No vote was needed at this time.

Councilmember Dwayne Sellers asked if the City could give property tax incentives to draw businesses into Burnside. City Attorney Orwin is to research the incentives. Councilmember Sellers also inquired about the Boy Scout house, there was nothing to new to report.

Dennis Jones asked if he could obtain the sewer logs, City Attorney Orwin instructed him to submit a written open records request and the City would comply.
