As there was a quorum present, Mayor Lawson called the September meeting of the City Council to order.

Mayor Lawson asked for a moment of silence for prayer. Mayor Lawson then led all those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Next order of business: First reading of Ordinance 2018-007, introduced by Randy Berry.

Updates on the progress made by the Code Enforcement Officer, Marc Travis, was introduced to the Council.

Next order of business: Mayor Lawson stated that the Park Committee had met, and voted to add Crissa Morris and Dwayne Sellers to the committee. Farrah Dobbs was elected as Chairperson for the Park Committee. Morris was also named Secretary of the Park Committee. Mayor Lawson asked for approval by the Council. Motion was made by Lula Jean Burton, seconded by Randy Berry. BERRY, YES; BURTON, YES; DAVIS, YES; GRIFFIN, YES; LYNN, YES; SELLERS, YES. The motion passed.

Chief Martin purchased a 2013 Dodge to replace the existing Suburban. He stated that with the trade-in and grant money provided by the county, the truck did not cost the City a dime. Farrah Dobbs, Tourism Director, purchased a 2018 6-passenger golf cart to be used at the City events, and for watering the flowers along HWY 27 for \$6500.
